## Follow-up from Mr. Barnum:

- 1- Digital citizenship fully CIPA compliant. Internet safety compliance and acceptable use policy. Filter through school internet system and on chrome books. Information is included in welcome packet for the school. 2-step authentication is in discussion for the school.
- 2- School Safety Plan- Fencing around building and addition and movement of gates so that campus will be fully enclosed. Lock to be installed at front office with window for students. Staff all have key fob for buildings. Required by state to do safety drill each month, lockdown, lockout drill, earthquake etc.
