## Vista Student Wins Utah VEX IQ Award by Kimberley Dawson

VEX IQ is a team collaboration where students are introduced to the fundamentals of science, technology, math, and engineering through robotics. VEX students use their problem-solving skills to design, create and operate a robot that can master various challenges. In the 2022-2023 school year, Vista School has been privileged to send our VRC and VEX IQ teams to the VEX Robotics World Championship event in Dallas. Our older teams placed in the middle, while the younger VEX IQ team, Vista Vikings, took 4th place in their division.

Sedona Sachatello, member of the Vista Vikings, was also recently awarded the Utah VEX IQ Student of the Year Award. Sedona served as a team strategist, researcher, and note booker. She also played an organizational role, keeping the competition schedule and parts bin up to date. All team members worked on coding and the building of their robot, Jonathanian 2.0.

"Being involved with robotics has taught me to problem solve and be resilient. It doesn't matter if you win or lose because you get to compete, and meet people, and have great experiences. I have learned time management, teamwork, coding and engineering - skills I will use my whole life," said Sedona.

When asked about her goals, Sedona stated, "To be as helpful as possible, ask what I can do to be productive, and stay focused or don't get distracted. I try to treat everyone with respect and kindness, even if it may be hard. I also try to keep everyone upbeat by being encouraging and making everyone laugh. Don't be a sore loser. Don't get upset. You can't win every time."

Sedona wants other students hoping to gain experience in robotics to know, "if you are just starting out, the best advice I can give is just keep trying. Keep learning new skills, keep researching, and redesigning. It's not going to be easy at first. Just don't give up!" continued on page 3
